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


## needs

crochet hook 3.5 for the motifs and 3 for the edge

needle

Larra Scheepjes in the following colors:



Above you see the amount of yarn that you need and under which these colors are used in the garment.



## important information

=This blanket is tunisian crochet, some knowledge of tunisian crochet is easy.
=You need just 10 stitches so you do not need a special needle.
=This blanket is made up of separate elements which are later on stitched together.
=I sew the pieces together with the overcasting stitch.
=Place the right sides together and insert the needle through both 'V's'
=At the end of each element I let left a long wire in order to sew together.

The blanket weighs 1005 grams and is 100 x 100 centimeters, reckoned without loops.



a list of the elements to crochet How much, in which color and in what size. All elements are 10 stitches wide and each square indicates 10 rows. I explain one element because the rest is the same just a different size. I crochet the smallest motif in color 7415

With crochet hook 3 you make 10 stitches and crochet 50 rows. (in my example I will just 10 for convenience) Now you increase

You do this by becoming not crocheting the last stitch.


Your work will then look like this.



1. Start with a regular stitch in the first horizontal loop

- 2. Get your hook through loop 1 and 2 so that it looks like picture 3 and then take a two through as usual at tunisian crochet.
- 3. Make a stitch described in the vertical bar and put in two horizontal bars as in step 2. You now have 4 loops on your hook as in picture 5. Get them back by 2 as usual.
  - 4. You already have two vertical loops (1 and 2 photo 6), hook and pick up two loops (3 and 4 photo 6) and crochet as usual.
- 5. This so on until you've had all loops and 9 stitches on your needle. The tenth stitch is the v with the 10 on photo 7
  - 6. Now you have another 10 stitches on your needle and you can continue.





#### Now crochet 10 rows and repeat the story of increase and decrease And then crochet 10 rows. fasten off your work.

The middle and largest size are in the same manner only the straight sections are longer.

small: 50 rows, increase, decrease, 10 rows, increase, decrease 10 rows middel :60 rows, increase, decrease, 30 rows, increase, decrease 20 rows biggest: 70 rows, increase, decrease, 50 rows, increase, decrease 30 rows Black blocks are 4 strips of 10 stitches and 40 rows squares are 10 stitches wide and 10 rows long And the four black bands are 10 stabbing wide and 40 rows long

## sewing



The elements sew together with the overcasting stitch. Place the right sides together and sew through both V's

For sewing you can use this scheme

Because the stitches not all agree, it is important to improvise a little. In order to work as neatly as possible.

Count the stitches every time 10 of the side and pin this down so that they remain on the squares. And then sew on sight always neatly tied together the two parts.



I finished the blanket with 3 rows of single crochet with needle 3.5



When your garment is put together you have to block for the best result. Measure properly and regularly span with many pins.



Now your blanket needs some straps. This are strips with 10 stitches and 25 rows You need 24 of them, 12 for upper and 12 for lower. After 25 rows you fold them in half and put them together with a slipstitch. Divide them now on top and bottom and sew neatly and securely with the overcasting stitch.
