

sunkissed fish bone wrap




As promised, here the pattern of the sunkissed fish bone wrap.

I call it a wrap because it is thin enough to be worn as a scarf,
but also wide enough to drape.

The sizes of this scarf is 6 feet and 6 inches long and 1 feet and 5 inches wide

The weight is 504 grams.




This is what you need and a crochet hook no 3



The wrap is made up of rectangles (and a few squares) of double crochet with a border of grey single crochet


The rectangles are without grey border about 1.8 inches wide and 3.8 inches long.

This is what we need:




Start with 25 chains
crochet your first stitch the third chain from your needle.
Now crochet 22 dc
In total you have 24 dc
Now crochet 4 rows.
In total 5 rows dc

The squares are you doing in the same way only do you start with 13 chains and you have 12 dc




We do the single crochet border with the gray cotton 8.
Make sure your tails of your rectangle are on the left.
You start with the upper right attachment.
(see picture below)



Now we make the grey border in single crochet
22 sc at the long sides, 10 on the short sides and 3 in the corners.

At the squares you crochet 11 on the long sides.

Make sure you leave behind a tail of wire about 20 inches to sew later.



sew togheter


Putting together.
I love variety,
so how I did it:

I crochet ever 6 rectangles of each color.
Then I foresaw them all 24 of a gray edge.
And then I sewed them together according to the schedule.
Where you work from top to bottom and from right to left.
And then row by row down.
So I started right corner with the red and black to put together.
Then again the red, then pink, red, and finally black.
Start again at the top right black rectangle, then the rose
And so on and on.

Then again il crochet 24 rectangles, give them a grey border
and then sew again

At the end I do the squares.

In this way, it remains a little varied.
Although I have enjoyed making this scarf,
from the beginning to the end!
Nice stuff, beautiful colors and beautiful design.
I'm happy with it :)




Inspiration
